### **COARC Offers Scholarships and Summer Arts Grants**

**Mellenville, New York (March 11, 2008)** – COARC announces scholarship opportunities for Columbia County residents who are students pursuing college-level education. Six scholarships totaling \$4000 are available; two \$750 Mary Markowitz Memorial Scholarships, two \$750 Kathelyn Caswell Memorial Scholarships, and two \$500 Annual COARC Employee Sponsored (A.C.E.S.) Determination Scholarships. All applicants must be Columbia County residents, and academic performance and personal recommendations are considered in awarding the scholarships. Applications must be received by May 1, 2008.

Mary Markowitz Memorial Scholarships are offered to adult college students who are accepted and matriculate in undergraduate college-level programs of study relevant to work with the disabled (e.g. rehabilitation counselor, special education teacher or an allied field). Kathelyn Caswell Memorial Scholarships are available to graduating high school students who are accepted and matriculate in undergraduate college-level programs of study relevant to work with the disabled (e.g. rehabilitation counselor, special education teacher or an allied field).

The two A.C.E.S. Determination scholarships will be awarded to graduating high school students who are experiencing disabilities. Applicants must be students who are accepted and matriculate in undergraduate college-level programs of study and they must have current Individual Education Plans (IEP) or 504 Plans on file with their school districts. Verification by school districts is required. Any course of college-level study is acceptable.

In addition to these scholarships, COARC also offers Summer Arts Grants to school-aged applicants who reside in Columbia County and who are also enrolled in special education programs. Grant money is awarded to students to pay for tuition or other expenses associated with enrolling in art, music or dance lessons during the summer months.

COARC scholarships and Summer Arts Grants recipients are selected by the COARC Board Education Committee and recipients will be announced on June 10, 2008.
