

Introducing Coarc Cares



Coarc Cares was developed in 2023 as an agency-wide initiative to highlight and promote give-back efforts both within Coarc and our broader community. We engaged in a variety of generous activities throughout the year, including:



Ability Link shopped for and donated essential items to food pantries in Hudson, Philmont, Ghent, and Chatham.

A Year of Success at The Starting Place

Since enrolling at The Starting Place (TSP) in Sept. 2021, Leah Perez has made significant progress in preschool. While she started off with limited language and motor skills, Leah has blossomed in all areas of her development thanks to her hard work and the supports she has received at TSP.

"Leah is a sweet, loving girl with a great sense of humor," says her teacher, Sophia Osofsky. "She enjoys learning, engages with peers and adults, and works hard toward her annual goals."

To support her continued progress, Leah practices her skills with TSP's service professionals. During her occupational therapy sessions, Leah practices her fine motor skills by writing her name, creating art, and playing games. In speech therapy, Leah has advanced from using picture boards to speaking with full sentences fluently in both Spanish and English. In physical therapy, Leah has developed her strength and gross motor skills through play and obstacle courses that involve lots of running, jumping, and climbing.

In 2024, Leah will graduate from TSP and move on to kindergarten, where she will surely continue to build on all of her accomplishments!

Coarc's Career Advancement Program Partners With NADSP

As a part of the agency's Career Advancement Program, Coarc continued its partnership with the National Alliance of Direct Support Professionals (NADSP) in 2023.

Through NADSP's E-Badge Academy, our direct support staff have advanced their skills and expertise through online courses while earning credentials and pay stipends based on their progress. The credentials offered include DSP-1, DSP-2, DSP-3, and Frontline Supervisor. Direct support staff who participate in the E-Badge Academy are awarded with certificates honoring their achievements during quarterly celebrations.

In recognition of the Career Advancement Program's excellence in its collaboration with NADSP, our fourth quarter celebration this year was attended by elected officials and representatives of the NYS Office for People with Developmental Disabilities, NADSP, and The Arc New York.

Coarc first began offering the E-Badge Academy program in 2020. In 2023, four frontline supervisors and 35 DSPs participated in this professional development opportunity.









Community Partner Spotlight: Bioforce USA

Bioforce USA is a Ghent-based distribution company of European natural brands. Since 2022, our Supported Employment (SEMP) program has collaborated with Bioforce USA to offer employment opportunities to people supported.

After Terry Shedrick graduated from Coarc's Ability Link program in 2023, he moved on to a paid internship at Bioforce. After he completes his internship, he will work toward his goal of becoming an employee at the company.

"I like feeling independent," says Terry. " It's nice to do things on my own, and Bioforce makes me feel I'm a part of a team."

"Terry has grown in many ways at Bioforce," SEMP Program Manager Brenda Baker has observed. "He has expanded his social skills through his interactions with coworkers, developed time management skills, and worked with labeling and packaging various products."

"Community integrated employment opportunities are so important for people living with autism, or any other disability, because they give people a feeling of independence and that they are important to the community," says Terry's mom, Sue Ann Shedrick.











